Outline of Waste Disposal in Izumo City

Welcome to Izumo. Waste-processing facilities and recyclable items differ by region, so waste disposal differs depending on the city where you live. We look forward to having you live in Izumo City and follow Izumo City's waste disposal rules along with the rest of the community.

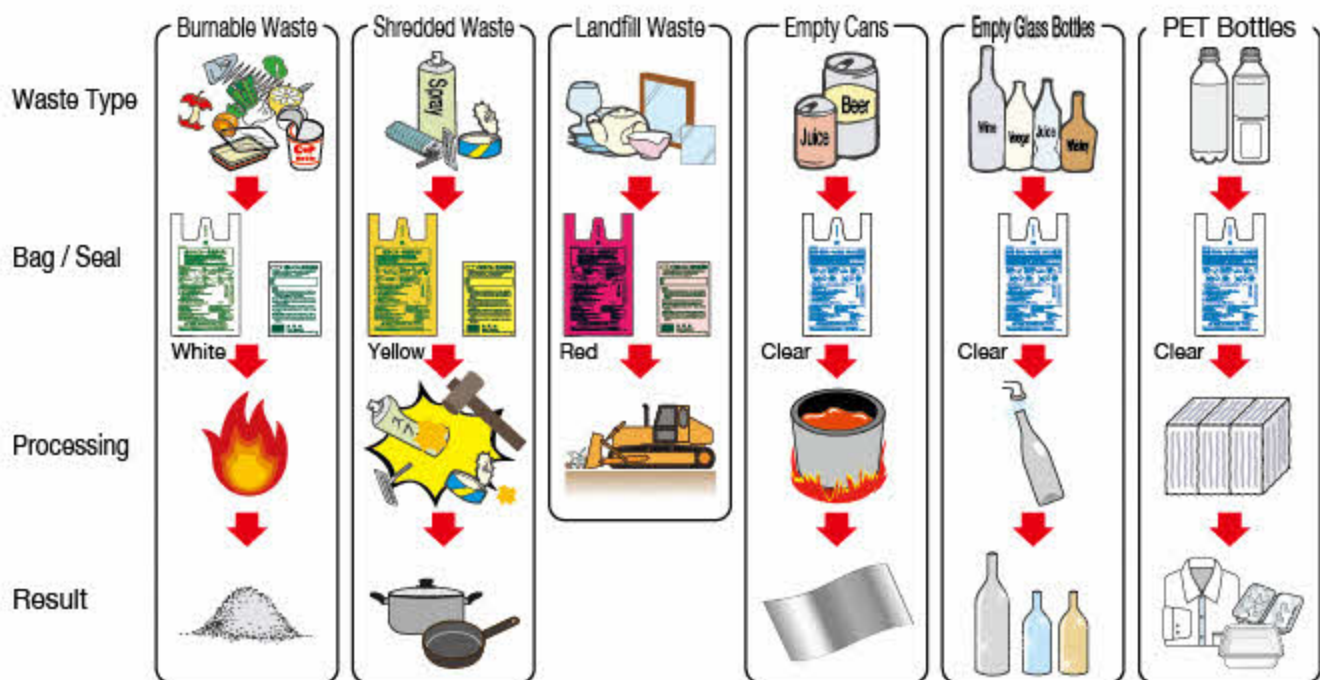
The Six Categories of Waste

Waste is divided into six categories because it is processed in different ways, and because some items can be recycled.

The categories are 1) Burnable Waste, 2) Shredded Waste, 3) Landfill Waste, 4) Empty Cans, 5) Empty Glass Bottles, 6) PET Bottles.

Each category has its own bag in a different color.

Empty cans, empty glass bottles, and PET bottles are all recycled.



Burnable Waste

(p. 8 - 9)

Includes organic waste, soft plastics, clothes, diapers, rubber items, tree branches, etc.



Shredded Waste

(p. 10 - 11)

Includes metals, small electronics, hard plastics, lighters, spray cans, etc.



Landfill Waste

(p. 11)

Includes broken glass, glass containers for cosmetics and oils, other glass items, ceramics/pottery, etc.

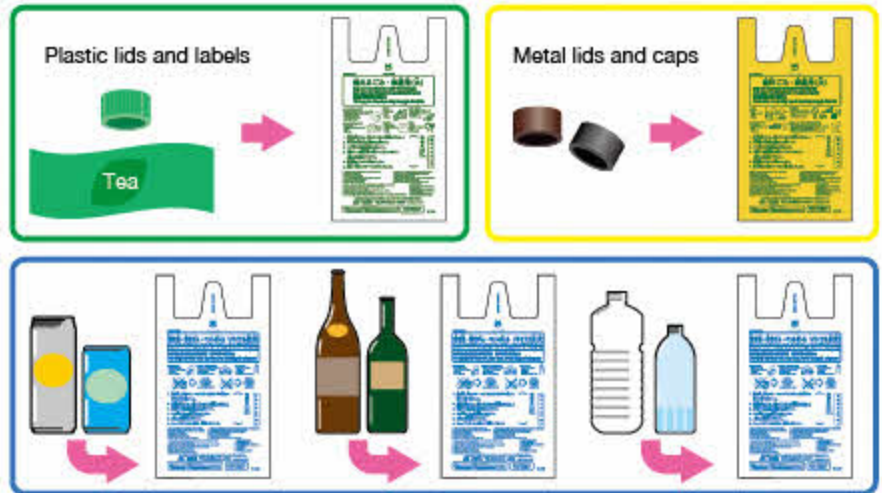


Empty Drink Cans, Glass Bottles, and PET Bottles

(p. 12 - 13)

Remove lids, caps, and labels.

Plastics labels and caps are Burnable Waste (white bag), and metal caps are Shredded Waste (yellow bag).



Put into a clear Recycling Bag. All of these waste products go into the same kind of bag, but cans, glass bottles, and PET bottles should not be put into the same bag for collection. The collection day and the recycling method is different for each of these products.

Bulky Waste

Includes any waste larger than 1 meter on any side. **You must make a reservation to dispose of Bulky Waste.** See p. 18 - 19 for details.

Rules for Waste Disposal

Read the next page carefully, and be sure to follow the rules when putting out your garbage.

Burnable Waste is collected 2 times a week, and Non-Burnable Waste is collected 1 or 2 times a month.

See your area's Waste Collection Calendar for details.





Rules for Waste Disposal

① Put waste out before **8:30 AM** on collection day.



Check collection days on the Waste Collection Calendar for your area, and put items out for collection by 8:30 AM on those days.

*Collection times may differ depending on traffic and available trucks.

Be sure to put your waste out by 8:30 AM. **Waste will not be collected if it is not put out on time.**

② Sort waste properly.

Refer to this guidebook for information on how to properly sort waste.

*Waste will not be collected if not sorted correctly.



If a metal piece over 3 cm is mixed in with Burnable Waste, the machinery at waste processing facilities may be damaged and require lots of money to fix.



Be sure to recycle papers, beverage cans, glass bottles, and PET bottles.



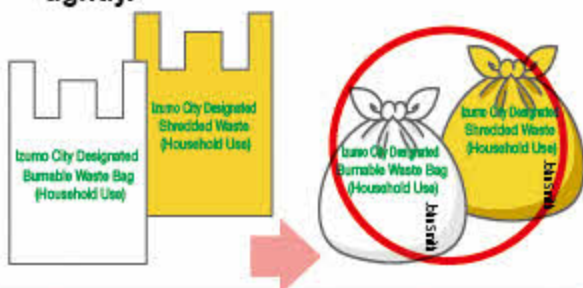
③ Write your name on bags and tie them tightly.

Write your name on the designated waste bag and tie it securely to prevent waste from scattering.

*Waste will not be collected if it does not have a name written on it or is not tied.

Q: What is the right way to tie bags?

A: Tie the right and left handles together tightly.



These bags will not be collected.



- ✗ Handles not tied together securely
- ✗ Taped closed, or tied shut with string
- ✗ Items sticking out of the bag

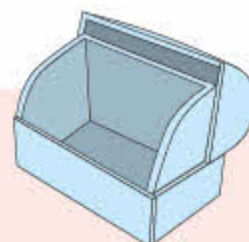
④ Use the right collection area.

Be sure to leave waste in your designated collection area.

*Waste collection areas are managed by the neighborhood associations who install them.

It is forbidden to leave your waste in another neighborhood's collection area without permission.

*You may dispose of up to 4 things at once (including bags of waste and items with collection tickets).



From April 4th, 2022, waste disposal **will change as follows:**

Part 1

Some Landfill Waste items will become Burnable Waste items.

Items Changing from Landfill Waste to Burnable Waste

- ① Rugs, carpets, and other floor coverings (no need to cut)
- ② Used, disposable kairo (heat packs), drying agents, and ice packs.
- ③ Video and cassette tapes

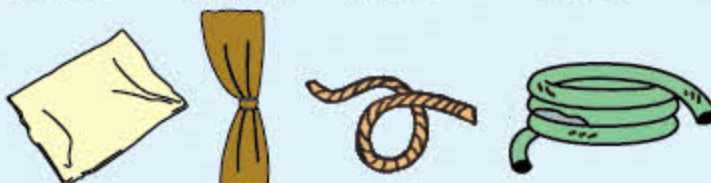


Part 2

Some items may be disposed in a different way.

- ① Large fabric items, ropes, and other long items may be disposed of in Burnable Waste Bags without being cut.

- Sheets
- Curtains
- Ropes
- Hoses



Only items which fit into the bag.

Electrical cords are Shredded Waste.

Place into the bag without cutting



- ② Small metal pieces (3 cm or less) attached to burnable materials may be left on when disposing in a Burnable Waste Bag.

*Please cut off metal pieces larger than 3 cm and dispose as Shredded Waste.

*Small metal items on their own should be disposed as Shredded Waste.

- Clothing/bags with metal buttons, zippers, etc.
- Tarps with metal eyelets, etc.



Place into Burnable Waste Bags without removing metals

Zippers over 3 cm do not need to be removed.

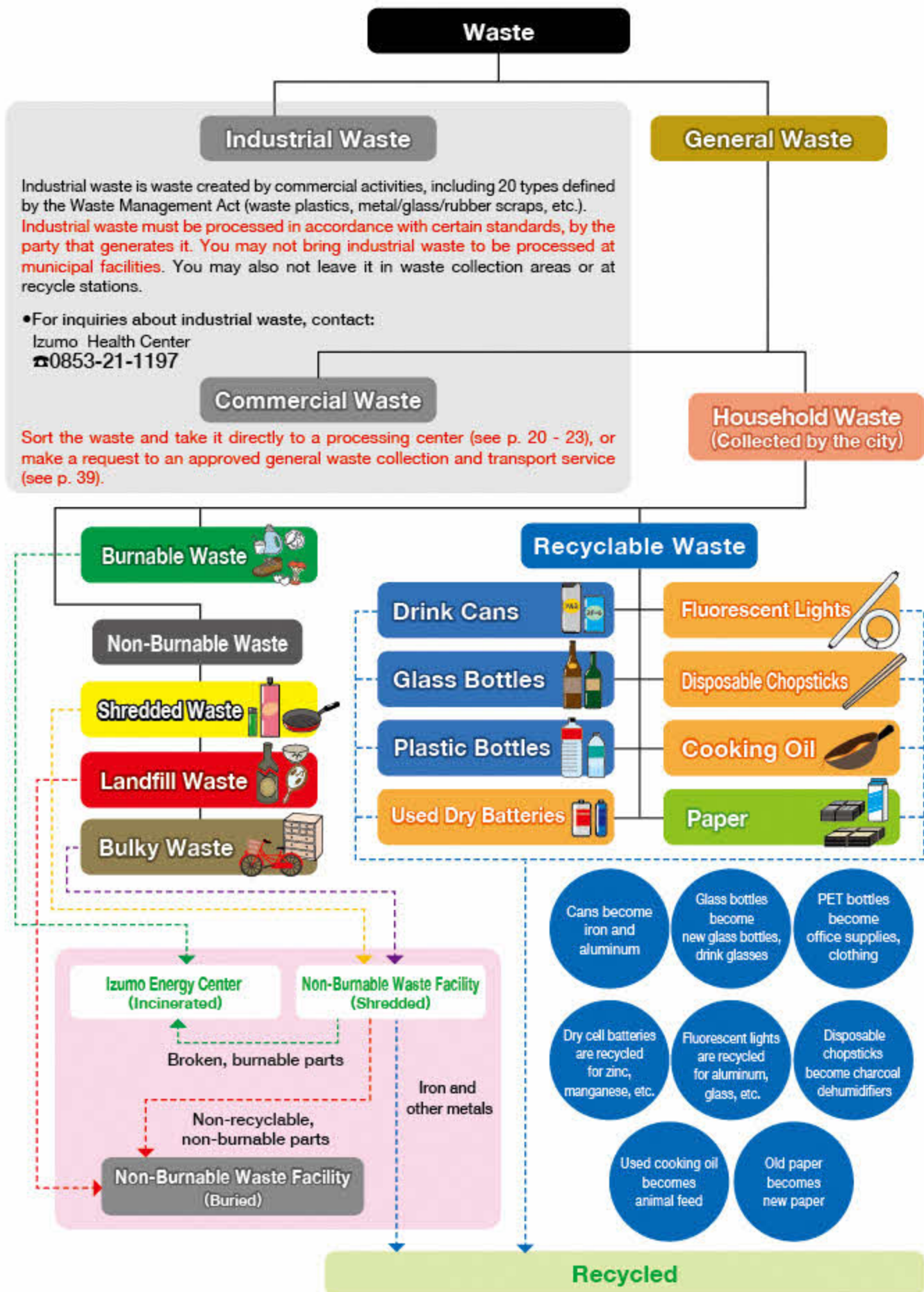

Types of Waste / Treatment Process





Types of Designated Waste Bags and Collection Tickets

Put waste into a designated city garbage bag, or affix with a collection seal before disposing of it (excluding used cylindrical batteries, mercury thermometers, and fluorescent lights).

You can **dispose of up to 4 waste items of each type at once**, including both items with a waste collection seal and in designated bags.

Write your name on each item, and tie bags securely to prevent waste from scattering.

Designated bags and collection tickets are sold at supermarkets, home centers, drug stores, and other shops within the city.

Designated Garbage Bags

There are 4 kinds of designated garbage bags: Burnable, Shredded, Landfill, and Can/Glass Bottle/Plastic Bottle (Recycling).

They come in large, small, and extra small (burnable waste only) sizes, with volume and weight limits as follows.

Collection Tickets

Dispose of waste that does not fit into the designated bags by affixing a collection ticket.

There are 4 types of waste collection tickets: Burnable, Shredded, Landfill, and Bulky Waste*.

The size limits, weight limits, and prices for each type of waste collection ticket are as follows.

*Bulky waste collection must be reserved in advance (see p. 18 for how to reserve).

Do not dispose of waste in cardboard boxes, fertilizer bags, or other such containers, even with a collection ticket.



» Burnable Waste



Dispose of burnable waste items **by inserting them into a designated Burnable Waste Bag (white with green text).**

Large bags hold up to 10 kg of waste, small bags 6 kg, and extra-small 3 kg.

You may dispose of **4 things at once**, including both bags of waste and items with collection tickets.

Burnable Waste Bag



Devices that use rechargeable batteries must be disposed of as Shredded Waste.
If treated as Burnable Waste, they will be compressed during collection, which can cause fires.



● Organic waste

Drain water before disposing



● Paper diapers

Remove excrement before disposing



● Ropes, hoses, etc.

No need to cut.
Metal pieces over 3 cm should be removed and disposed of as Shredded Waste.

Metal pieces over 3 cm should be removed and disposed of as Shredded Waste. If you cannot detach metal pieces, dispose of the whole item as Shredded Waste.

● Tarps and curtains

Metal pieces over 3 cm should be removed and disposed of as Shredded Waste.

● Rubber items



● Balls

(Golf balls, baseballs, soccer balls, volleyballs, etc.)

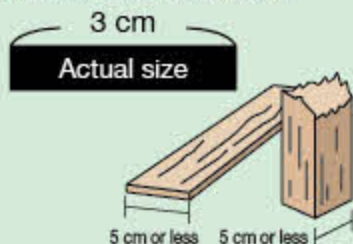
Metal balls are Shredded Waste, and resin balls are Landfill Waste.



● Tree scraps and fallen leaves



- Wood scraps (5 cm or less in diameter, small enough to fit in the designated bag)
Remove metal pieces larger than 3 cm and dispose as Shredded Waste. If you cannot detach metal pieces, dispose of the whole item as Shredded Waste.



As of April 4th, 2022

- Futons and blankets

Dispose in a Burnable Waste Bag, as long as they fit in the bag. If they do not fit into a bag, they may be disposed of with a Burnable Waste Collection Seal or Bulky Waste Collection Seal, depending on their size.



As of April 4th, 2022

- Rugs, carpets, and other floor coverings

There is no need to cut these items. Dispose in a Burnable Waste Bag, as long as they fit in the bag. If they do not fit into a bag, they may be disposed of with a Burnable Waste Collection Seal or Bulky Waste Collection Seal, depending on their size.



As of April 4th, 2022

- Video and cassette tapes (including cases)



- Disposable kairo (heat packs)

Only dispose after using.



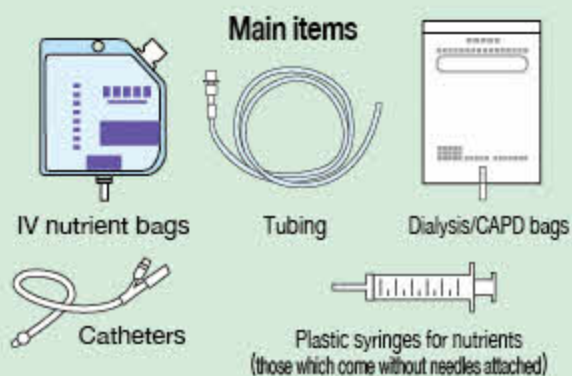

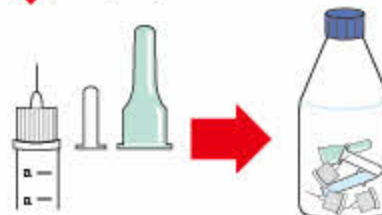

- The following home-based medical waste items (not including syringes and hypodermic needles)



Syringes, hypodermic needles, and other sharp objects included in home-based medical waste items cannot be disposed of as Burnable Waste. Consult with a pharmacy, drugstore, or the medical facility that provided them.



Pharmacies, drugstore, medical facilities

How to Use Waste Collection Seals

Affix a Burnable Waste Collection Seal to Burnable Waste items that do not fit into the designated bags. **You must use 1 Waste Collection Seal per item.**

Waste Collection Seals can be used for items up to 1 meter in any direction, with the height/width/depth totaling up to 2 meters, weighing up to 10 kg.

Please use Bulky Waste Collection Seals (see p. 18 - 19) for larger or heavier items.



Burnable Waste Collection Seal

- Twigs



Each twig should have a diameter of 5 cm or less, and bundles a diameter of 50 cm or less.

- Futons, blankets, and mats that do not fit into Burnable Waste Bags

Items that fit in a Burnable Waste Bag should be placed into one.



Remove covers and sheets, and dispose of those in Burnable Waste Bags. Fold and tie items separately, and affix 1 Waste Collection Seal to each item.

- Rugs and carpets that do not fit into Burnable Waste Bags

Items that fit in a Burnable Waste Bag should be placed into one.



Fold and tie items separately, and affix 1 Waste Collection Seal to each item.

» Shredded Waste



Shredded Waste Bag

Dispose of shredded waste items **by inserting them into a designated Shredded Waste Bag (yellow).**

Large bags hold up to 10 kg of waste, small bags 6 kg, and extra-small 3 kg.

You may dispose of **4 things at once**, including both bags of waste and items with collection tickets.

Metals

The fabric and plastic parts of umbrellas are Burnable Waste.



For safety reasons, please wrap blades and knives before disposing.

Disposing of Blades and Knives



Wrap in paper or cloth, write "hamono" or "hasami" on the outside, and place into a Shredded Waste Bag.

Lighters and Spray Cans



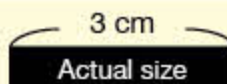
Use up contents completely before disposing. Contents left in these items can start fires during waste collection. There is no need to cut holes in spray cans.



Hard Plastics (including metal composites)



Wooden Items



Items between 5 - 20 cm in height and width, with metal pieces 3 cm or less, should be disposed of in a Shredded Waste Bag. **Items less than 5 cm in height and width (with no metal pieces over 3 cm) may be treated as Burnable Waste.**



Small Household Appliances

Remove and recycle batteries (dry cell, button cell, rechargeable).

See p. 13 for instructions



Coil or wrap cords rather than cutting them.



TVs, refrigerators/freezers, washing machines, clothing dryers, and air conditioners fall under the Home Appliance Recycling Law, and are not collected by the city. Computers are also not collected by the city due to the Law on the Effective Utilization of Resources. See p. 24 - 25 for details on how to dispose of these items.

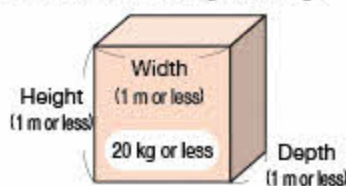
How to Use Waste Collection Seals

Affix a Shredded Waste Collection Seal to Shredded Waste items that do not fit into the designated bags.

You must use 1 Waste Collection Seal per item.

Waste Collection Seals can be used for items up to 1 meter in any direction, with the height/width/depth totaling up to 2 meters, weighing up to 20 kg.

Please use Bulky Waste Collection Seals (see p. 18 - 19) for larger or heavier items.

Remove batteries and oil

» Landfill Waste

Dispose of landfill waste items **by inserting them into a designated Landfill Waste Bag (red)**.

Large bags hold up to 10 kg of waste, small bags 6 kg, and extra-small 3 kg.

You may dispose of **4 things at once**, including both bags of waste and items with collection tickets.

Landfill Waste Bag



Breakable Items and Blades

Please wrap broken items before disposing.

- Broken glass
- Glass bottles which cannot be fully cleaned (for oils, cosmetics, etc.)
- Glass containers with a wide opening (for seaweed, umeshu, etc.)
- Ceramics/pottery
- Glass items (cups, mugs, coffee pots, glass panes, etc.)
- Mirrors
- Lightbulbs
- Blades from box cutters and shavers (wrap before disposing)



Disposing of Broken Glass/Plates and Blades



Wrap in paper or cloth, write "garasu" or "hamono" on the outside, and place into a Landfill Waste Bag.

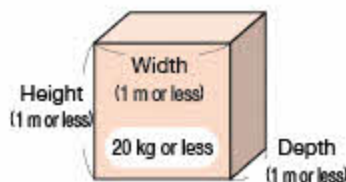
How to Use Waste Collection Seals

Affix a Landfill Waste Collection Seal to Landfill Waste items that do not fit into the designated bags.

You must use 1 Waste Collection Seal per item.

Waste Collection Seals can be used for items up to 1 meter in any direction, with the height/width/depth totaling up to 2 meters, weighing up to 20 kg.

Please use Bulky Waste Collection Seals (see p. 18 - 19) for larger or heavier items.



Depth (m) + Width (m) + Height (m) = 2 m or less

» Empty Beverage Cans (Recycle)



Recycling Bag

Dispose of beverage cans in the designated bag marked "Cans · Glass Bottles · PET Bottles". **Do not mix beverage cans with PET or glass bottles.**

You may dispose of 4 bags at once.

Aluminum and steel cans can go in the same bag.

» Empty Glass Bottles (Recycle)



Recycling Bag

Dispose of glass bottles in the designated bag marked "Cans · Glass Bottles · PET Bottles". **Do not mix glass bottles with cans or PET bottles.**

You may dispose of 4 bags at once.

Return beer bottles, sake bottles (1.8 L), milk bottles, and other reusable bottles to their stores if at all possible.

Items Collected

- Containers for seasonings, condiments, and other foods (excluding oil and seaweed)
- Medication bottles
- Drink bottles



Other glass items, broken bottles, containers with a wide opening (for seaweed, umeshu, etc.), and bottles which cannot be fully cleaned (for oils, cosmetics, etc.) are...

Disposing of Glass Bottles

- ① Remove the lid and the label.

If the label cannot be removed, please dispose of the bottle as-is.

Labels and plastic lids are Burnable Waste, while metal lids are Shredded Waste.



- ② Wash out the bottle thoroughly.



» PET Bottles (Recycle)

Dispose of PET bottles in the designated bag marked "Cans · Glass Bottles · PET Bottles." **Do not mix PET bottles with cans or glass bottles.**

You may dispose of 4 bags at once.



Recycling Bag

Recyclable Bottles

- PET Bottles for drinks, alcohol, and cooking ingredients (excluding oils and strong-smelling materials)

Containers used for oil, strong-smelling items (such as sauces), and non-food items (soap, etc.) are treated as...

Preparing PET Bottles for Disposal

- ① Remove the cap and label.
Caps and labels are Burnable Waste.



- ② Wash the inside thoroughly.



» Used Cylindrical Batteries, etc. (Recycle)

Used Cylindrical Batteries / Mercury Thermometers

There is no designated bag. Place in a clear or translucent bag, write your name on the bag, and put out on the same day that Landfill Waste is collected. Do not place in a Landfill Waste Bag.

Button Cell Batteries

These batteries are not collected as general waste. Depending on the model, they should be taken to different places.

Model number "CR" and "BR" (contain no mercury)

→ Bring to the Environmental Facilities Division at Izumo City Hall

Model number "SR," "PR," and "LR" (contain mercury)

→ Not collected by the city. Electronics stores may accept them when you buy replacement batteries. Consult with the city if the store does not take them.



Rechargeable Batteries

Nickel-cadmium batteries, nickel-metal hydride batteries, and lithium-ion batteries are **not collected as general waste.**

Take them to an electronics store, or to the special collection box on the 1st floor of Izumo City Hall.

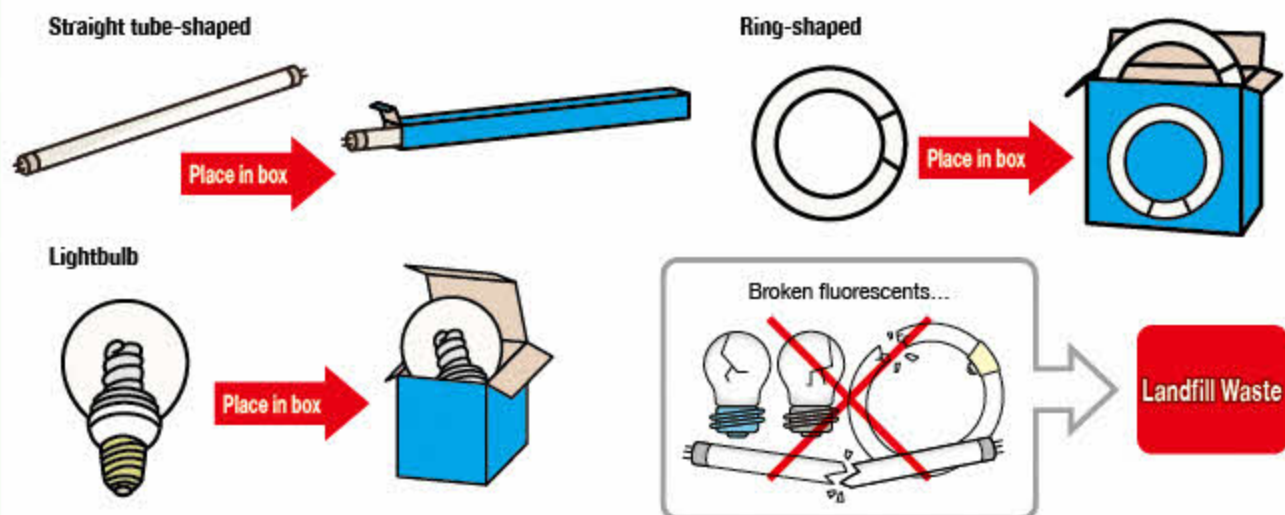

» Used Fluorescent Lights (Recycle)

There is no designated bag. Place in the box it came in, and put out on the same day that Landfill Waste is collected. **Do not place in a Landfill Waste Bag.** If you don't have the box it came in, place it in a box that will protect it from breaking, and write "*hai-keikōkan*" on the box. You don't need to write your name.

Dispose of broken fluorescent lights in a Landfill Waste Bag.

LEDs cannot be recycled. Treat plastic LEDs as Shredded Waste, and glass LEDs as Landfill Waste. Some stores collect old LEDs. Contact stores directly for more information.



» Disposable Chopsticks (Recycle)

Place in collection boxes (**wooden disposable chopsticks only**) on the first floor of Izumo City Hall, the city's administrative centers, and community centers.

Bamboo and lacquered chopsticks are Burnable Waste.

● Wooden disposable chopsticks



» Cooking Oil (Recycle)

Pour cooking oils (plant-based oils only) back into the container they came in, and bring to the basement of City Hall, administrative centers, or community centers to dispose of in the collection tanks there.

The tanks are available 8:30 - 17:00 on weekdays.

(Hikawa area facilities are available on weekends only, 8:30 - 17:00)

Do not put machinery oil, animal-based oils (lard, etc.), or oil containing food scraps into the tanks.



» Paper (Recycle)

Paper is **reused and recycled** in many different ways depending on its type, so it is important to sort it properly when disposing. Please sort your paper waste into the following four categories:

1) Newspaper and inserts 2) Magazines, books, and miscellaneous papers 3) Paper cartons 4) Cardboard. Remove any plastic or metal pieces, and bring to a recycle station (p. 16 - 17).

- Newspaper
- Newspaper inserts



- Magazines
- Books
- Miscellaneous papers



- Paper cartons (milk, etc.)



- Cardboard



Secure tightly with plastic or paper string before putting out for collection.

"Miscellaneous papers" include...

Tissue boxes (with plastic part removed), snack or candy boxes, food packaging boxes, pamphlets, leaflets, calendars, wrapping paper, office supplies, memo pads, envelopes (with plastic part removed), cardboard tube from plastic wrap, etc.

- Tissue boxes
(plastic parts are Burnable Waste)



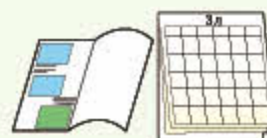
- Boxes for snacks, ice cream, etc.



- Beer cases



- Pamphlets, calendars



- Cardboard tube from plastic wrap, foil, or toilet paper



- Boxes for plastic wrap or foil
(metal parts are Shredded Waste, plastic parts are Burnable Waste)



Tip for Disposal

You can insert papers in between the pages of magazines/books, or into envelopes or paper bags before recycling.

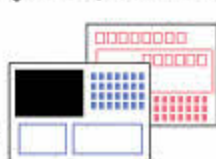


The following paper materials cannot be recycled. Please dispose as Burnable Waste.

Dirty papers, photographic prints, photo albums, thermal paper, non-carbon duplicating paper, washi paper, oiled paper, carbon paper, plastic-coated paper, wax paper (e.g., paper cups, rice bags), stickers and their backing paper, foil cartons (e.g. for heavy cream), detergent boxes, incense boxes

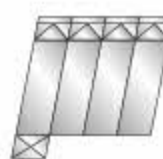

- Closed on public holidays, replacement holidays, and New Year's Holidays (Dec. 29 - Jan 4).



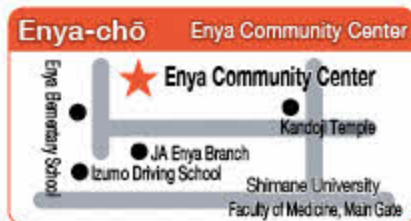
- You may use any recycle station within the city.

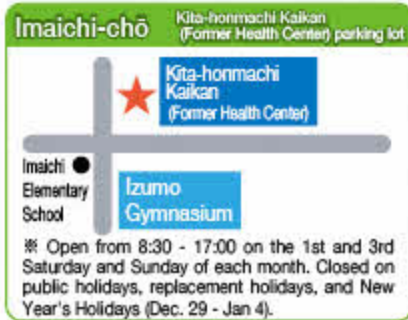

Talsha Area (Items collected: Paper, cans, glass bottles, PET bottles)

- Bring items to district-designated stations from 7:30 - 12:00.
- Closed on public holidays, replacement holidays, and New Year's Holidays (Dec. 29 - Jan 4).
- See the Waste Collection Calendar for information on collection dates for each waste item.



- Any city resident may bring specified waste items to the Community Centers listed below on the designated days.



※In addition to those listed above, there are other Recycle Stations established by neighborhood councils.

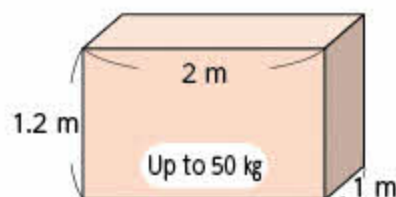
Bulky Waste Collection Seal

Bulky Waste collection requires an application and advance reservation.

1 household may dispose of up to 4 items at once time. Collection days differ depending on where you live. Check the Waste Collection Calendar for details.

From Reservation to Collection

- ① Check the size and weight of your waste items.



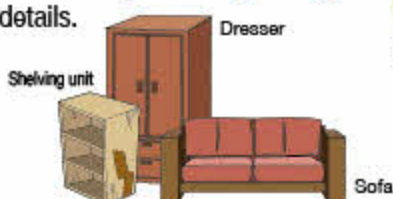
Size: up to 2 m x 1.2 m x 1 m

Weight: up to 50 kg (can be lifted by 2 adults)

*See p. 39 for a list of service providers that can dispose of items over the size and weight limits.

*Futons, carpets, and other such items may be disposed of with a Burnable Waste Collection Seal if, when folded, they are 1 m or less in any direction, with the height/width/depth totaling up to 2 m, weighing up to 10 kg.

*Small household appliances may be disposed of with a Shredded Waste Collection Seal if they are 1 m or less in any direction, with the height/width/depth totaling up to 2 m, weighing up to 20 kg.



- ② Make a Reservation.

- Call the Environmental Facilities Division at **0853-21-6988**.
- Reservations can be made until 12 PM on the day before collection. If this day falls on a weekend or public holiday, reservations can be made until the last day that City Hall is open prior to collection day.

- ③ Buy a Bulky Waste Collection Seal (1,047 yen each, 1 needed per item) at a supermarket, home center store, or drug store within the city. Write your name on the seal and affix it directly to the waste item(s).
- ④ Place the waste item(s) in the location decided at the time of reservation (e.g., in front of your home, in a waste collection area) by 8:30 AM on collection day. The item(s) will be collected by the evening of that day. There is no need to be there when the waste is collected.

*Waste collectors will not enter your home.

*You cannot specify a time for collection.

*Only the items you applied for will be collected. If you want to make any changes to your reservation, please be sure to call.

Special Cases: When you can dispose of more than 1 item with just 1 Collection Seal

In principle, each waste item needs its own Bulky Waste Collection Seal, but the items listed below are special cases in which 1 Bulky Waste Collection Seal can be used for multiple items.

Items	Number allowed	Notes
Drying rods or other rod-shaped items	5 (of the same type)	Each rod must be 2 m or less in length. Includes drying rods, curtain rails, fishing poles, etc. Tie together with a rope.
Clothes drying racks	1 set	Two stands make one set. If they weigh over 50 kg together, 1 Collection Seal will be necessary for each.
Galvanized sheet iron	5 sheets	Must not exceed size or weight limits for Bulky Waste. Tin and plastic galvanized sheets may be disposed the same way.

Bulky Waste Items Not Collected by the City

Be advised that the following items will not be collected as Bulky Waste.

- ✗ Items over the size or weight limit for Bulky Waste
- ✗ Items that cannot be removed from your house
- ✗ Sofa beds

Waste processing facilities cannot process spring mattresses as-is. (Contact a specialty service listed on p. 39)

If you can remove the springs, you may dispose of them as Bulky Waste, and the remaining fabric/padding as Burnable Waste.

» Aid Systems for Waste Disposal

Izumo City offers aid to cover part of the costs associated with installing new waste collection areas, as well as updating or repairing these areas. If you would like to use this aid system, please be sure to consult with the Environmental Facilities Division before paying any costs.

Conditions for Aid

The following 3 conditions must be met to be considered eligible for aid.

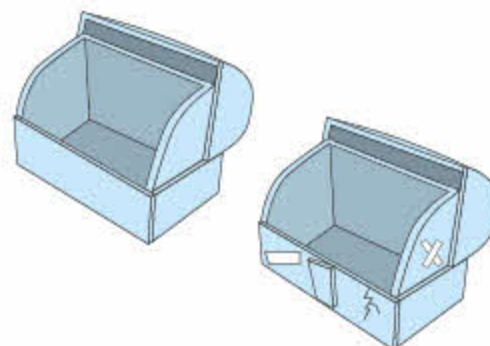
- ① Waste collection area is in use by 5 or more households
- ② Waste collection area is maintained and managed by the residents of the area
- ③ Costs are 10,000 yen or more

Aid Amounts

Up to half of the costs of eligible areas. Amount will be rounded down to the nearest 1,000 yen. For example, if costs are 85,000 yen, 42,500 is half, but only 42,000 will be covered.

- ① To install a new or updated waste collection area for use by 5 - 19 households Upper limit 50,000 yen
- ② To install a new or updated waste collection area for use by 20 or more households Upper limit 100,000 yen
- ③ To repair a waste collection area Upper limit 20,000 yen

» Bringing Waste Directly to Processing Facilities

If you have a large amount of waste due to moving houses or doing a major cleaning, you can bring the waste directly to a processing facility, or hire a general waste collection and transport service (see p. 39).

You do not need to use designated waste collection bags or seals if bringing the waste directly to a processing facility. You will be charged as described in the table to the right, regardless of if the waste is in designated bags or not.

Please download and fill out a *hannyū todokede sho* (搬入届出書, JPN only) to bring to the processing facility if at all possible.

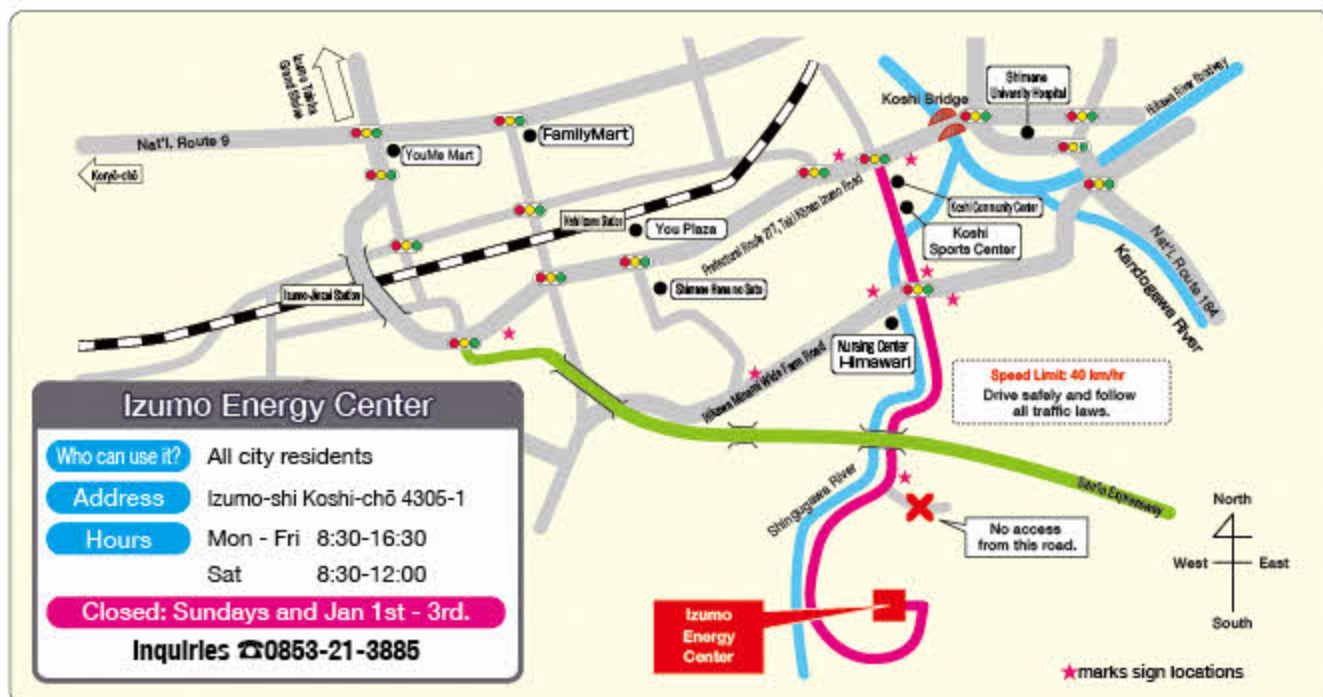

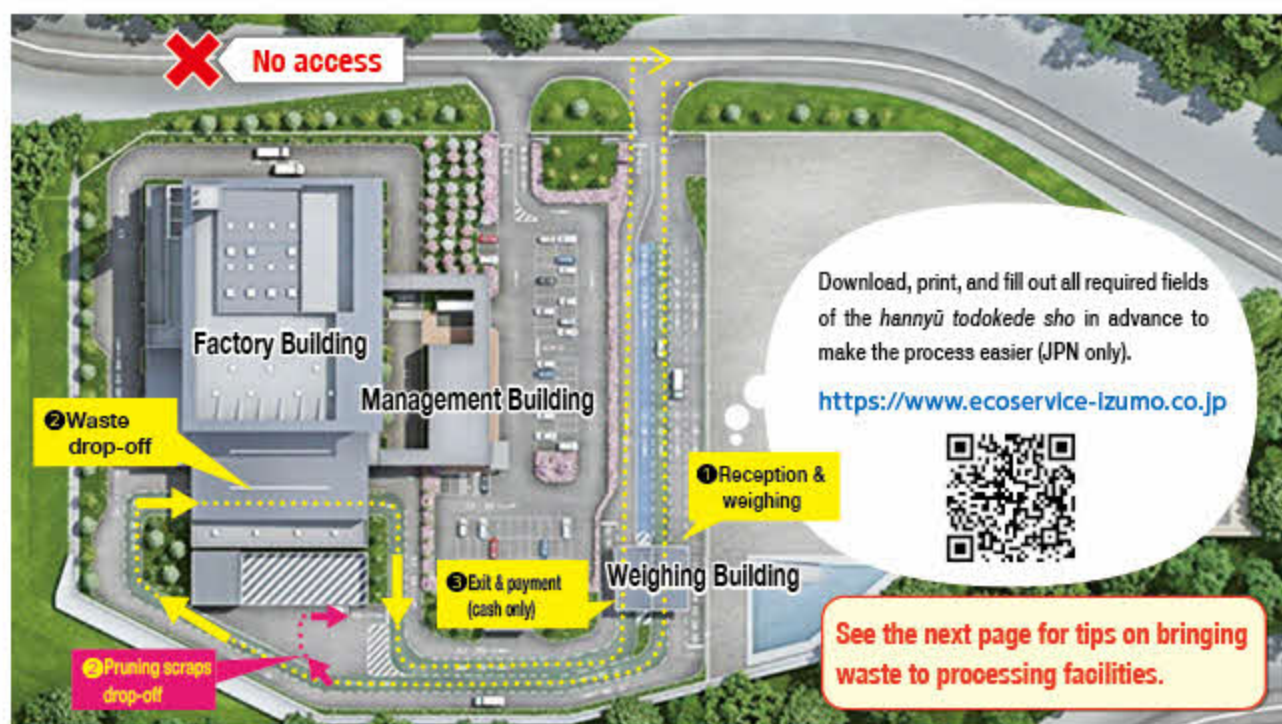

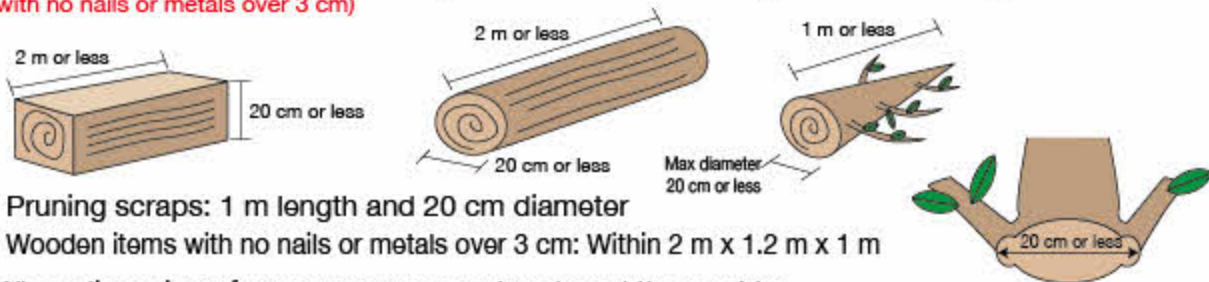
When dropping off burnable waste, go to areas ①, ②, and ③ in order based on the map below.



Tips for Bringing Burnable Waste to a Facility

① Be sure to keep waste items within the following size limits.

- Long items like wooden boards, squared timber, etc.: 2 m length and 20 cm height/width (with no nails or metals over 3 cm)



- Pruning scraps: 1 m length and 20 cm diameter
- Wooden items with no nails or metals over 3 cm: Within 2 m x 1.2 m x 1 m

② When disposing of grass, remove sand and mud thoroughly.

③ Bring grass to the facility in a vehicle with max loading capacity of 2 tons or less.

④ Bring pruning scraps to the facility in a vehicle with max loading capacity of 4 tons or less.

⑤ Place large fabric pieces (bedsheets, curtains, etc.) and long, flexible items (ropes, hoses, etc.) into a garbage bag about the size of the city's designated bags (40 L).

⑥ If a metal or ceramic piece over 3 cm is mixed in with the burnable waste, Izumo Energy Center's machinery will be damaged and waste processing will stop. Be sure to sort waste properly.

⑦ Follow staff members' instructions and guidance at the drop-off sites.

⑧ Bring plenty of small change with you to avoid the need for change when paying.

Waste Not Permitted at Izumo Energy Center

- ❌ Waste produced outside of Izumo City → Inquire with the municipality where the waste was produced.
- ❌ Industrial waste → Inquire with Izumo Health Center (*Izumo hokenjo*). ☎0853-21-1197
- ❌ Items made mainly of metal, home appliances/electronics, items with lithium-ion batteries (e-cigs, portable chargers, etc.) → Put out for collection as Shredded Waste, or bring directly to a Non-Burnable Waste processing facility.
- ❌ Items containing mercury (mercury-based blood pressure monitors, thermometers) → Put out for collection as Recyclables, or bring directly to a Non-Burnable Waste processing facility.
- ❌ Car tires, motor oil, medications → Contact a specialty service.
- ❌ Infectious medical waste (hypodermic needles, etc.) → Contact a medical facility, pharmacy, or drug store.

To reduce waste and improve the environment, please recycle PET bottles, papers, and clothing.



Bringing Non-Burnable Waste to Processing Facilities

Drop-off sites for non-burnable waste differ depending on where you live. You do not need to use designated waste collection bags or seals if bringing the waste directly to a processing facility. You will be charged as described in the table to the right, regardless of if the waste is in designated bags or not. Please download and fill out a *hannyū todokede sho* (搬入届出書, JPN only) to bring to the processing facility if at all possible.

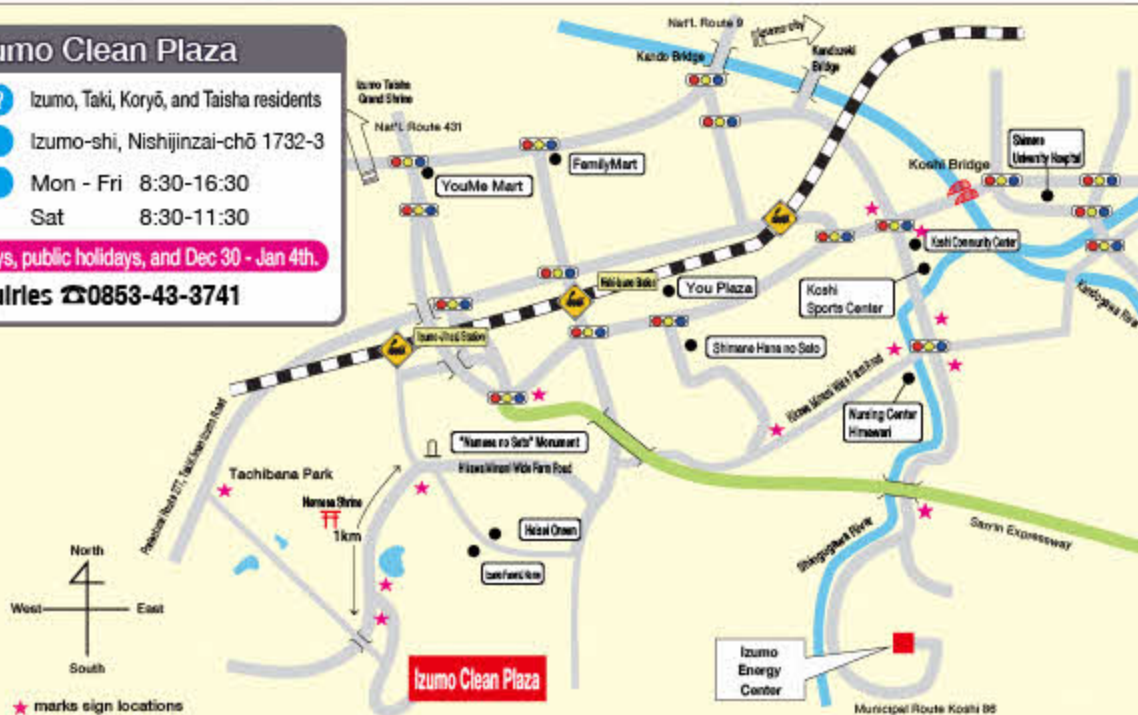

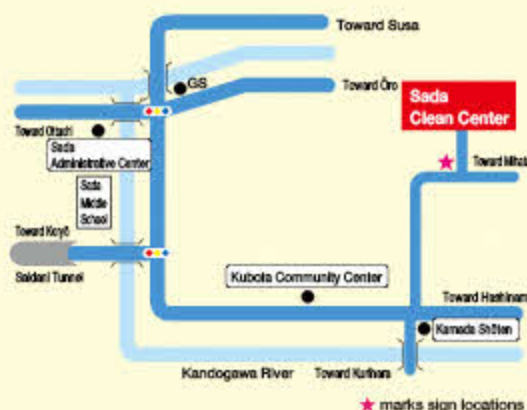

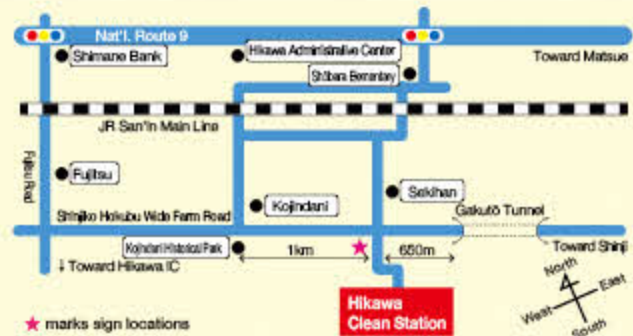

Tips for Bringing Non-Burnable Waste to a Facility

① Be sure that each waste item weighs 50 kg or less, and keep all items within the following size limits.

- Long and thin items: 2 m length and 20 cm diameter (wooden boards and squared timber: 20 cm height/width)

*Only if metal or hard plastic pieces over 3 cm are attached (items without metal or hard plastic pieces over 3 cm should be taken to Izumo Energy Center).

- Furniture: 2 m x 1.2 m x 1 m or less



- ② Waste may only be brought to the facility by members of the household that produced it, or by an approved general waste collection and transport service.
- ③ There are different drop-off sites for Shredded Waste and Landfill Waste within the facility. Be sure to sort waste properly.
- ④ Bring plenty of small change with you to avoid the need for change when paying.

Waste Not Permitted at Non-Burnable Waste Processing Facilities

- ✗ Waste produced outside of Izumo City** → Inquire with the municipality where the waste was produced.
- ✗ Industrial waste** → Inquire with Izumo Health Center (Izumo hokenjo). ☎0853-21-1197
- ✗ Rugs, carpets, and other floor coverings; used, disposable kairo (heat packs), ice packs, and preservatives/desiccants; video and cassette tapes** → Put out for collection as Burnable Waste, or bring directly to Izumo Energy Center.
- ✗ Wooden items or other Burnable Waste items containing metal pieces 3 cm or less** → Put out for collection as Burnable Waste, or bring directly to Izumo Energy Center. Items with multiple metal pieces are still Burnable Waste as long as all metal pieces are 3 cm or less.
- ✗ Other prohibited waste items:**
 - Rechargeable batteries (nickel-cadmium, nickel-metal hydride, and lithium-ion)
 - Button cell batteries
 - Devices included in the Home Appliance Recycling Law
 - Computers, fire extinguishers, gas cylinders
 - Tires, car batteries, small motorcycles (*gentsuki*)
 - Liquid items (paint, medication, motor oil, etc.)
 - Infectious medical waste (hypodermic needles, etc.)
 → There are other items not accepted at these facilities. Please see the section "Waste Sorting at a Glance" (p. 27 - 38) for more information on these items and how to dispose of them. Please contact the Environmental Facilities Division if you have any questions.

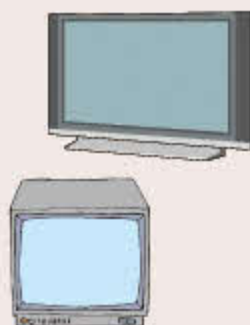

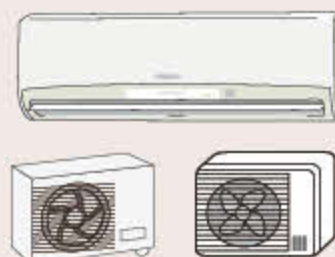

3. Bring the computer to a post office and send it.



PC Recycle Mark

All computers sold as of October 2003 are printed with a PC Recycle Mark (left), which shows that recycle fees were paid at the time of purchase. For computers sold prior to October 2003, recycle fees will need to be paid at the time of disposal.

Illegal Dumping is a Crime!

Unlawful disposal of waste on roadsides, empty lots, in the mountains, and in forests is a crime. Bringing waste somewhere other than a designated collection site without permission is also a crime. Please dispose of your waste properly in order to keep our city clean and beautiful.

















Penalties for Illegal Dumping

In accordance with laws concerning waste disposal and sanitation, individuals who attempt or carry out illegal dumping will be subject to up to five years of prison time, a fine of up to 10 million yen, or both. Corporations and other such groups will be subject to a fine of up to 300 million yen.



» Other Waste Not Collected by the City

The city does not collect improperly sorted waste or waste that cannot be processed by city facilities. To dispose of these items, please contact a waste collection service or other specialty service directly (see p. 39). For the disposal of industrial waste, please contact Izumo Health Center (or JA for agricultural waste).

Pet Remains

The city does not collect or process the remains of deceased pets.

Please bring remains directly to the Izumo Energy Center (see p. 20 - 21).

*Ashes will not be returned after cremation. Cremation fee: 3,142 yen/animal.

There are also privately operated pet funeral facilities offering cremation, storage of remains, transfer of ashes to an urn, and memorial services within the city.

Disposal of Commercial Waste

Waste produced by commercial venues can be categorized as "industrial waste" or "general waste." There are different ways to dispose of these different categories.

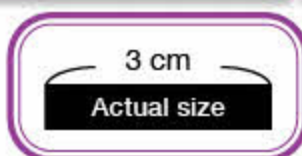

General Waste	Follow one of the methods below for proper disposal. You cannot dispose of waste produced outside of the city with these methods. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Bring waste directly to a waste processing facility yourself (see p. 20 - 23). → You will be charged a processing fee of 157 yen/10 kg. 2. Request disposal by a service approved by the city (see p. 39). → Fees depend on the amount of waste and how many times it must be collected. Confirm directly with the service for details. 3.
