

## » Paper ( Recycle )

Paper is **reused and recycled** in many different ways depending on its type, so it is important to sort it properly when disposing. Please sort your paper waste into the following four categories:

1) Newspaper and inserts 2) Magazines, books, and miscellaneous papers 3) Paper cartons 4) Cardboard. Remove any plastic or metal pieces, and bring to a recycle station (p. 16 - 17).

- Newspaper
- Newspaper inserts



- Magazines
- Books
- Miscellaneous papers



- Paper cartons (milk, etc.)



- Cardboard



Secure tightly with plastic or paper string before putting out for collection.

### "Miscellaneous papers" include...

Tissue boxes (with plastic part removed), snack or candy boxes, food packaging boxes, pamphlets, leaflets, calendars, wrapping paper, office supplies, memo pads, envelopes (with plastic part removed), cardboard tube from plastic wrap, etc.

- Tissue boxes  
(plastic parts are Burnable Waste)



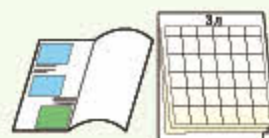
- Boxes for snacks, ice cream, etc.



- Beer cases



- Pamphlets, calendars



- Cardboard tube from plastic wrap, foil, or toilet paper



- Boxes for plastic wrap or foil  
(metal parts are Shredded Waste, plastic parts are Burnable Waste)



### Tip for Disposal

You can insert papers in between the pages of magazines/books, or into envelopes or paper bags before recycling.

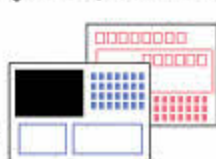


The following paper materials cannot be recycled. Please dispose as Burnable Waste.

Dirty papers, photographic prints, photo albums, thermal paper, non-carbon duplicating paper, washi paper, oiled paper, carbon paper, plastic-coated paper, wax paper (e.g., paper cups, rice bags), stickers and their backing paper, foil cartons (e.g. for heavy cream), detergent boxes, incense boxes

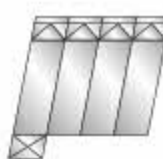
Thermal paper, non-carbon duplicating paper, carbon paper
