


The force of impact of a vehicle crash at 40 km/h is equivalent to 30 times one's body weight. The force a 10-kg child feels is 300 kg! No matter how strong you are, your child cannot be properly protected without a car seat.

Protect your child by using the appropriate child seat!

According to the Japanese Road Traffic Act, a child seat must be used when a child under 6 years old rides in the car (one demerit point is added to your traffic record for breaking this law.)

What if my child doesn't like the seat?

Getting your child used to using a car seat is a task that requires discipline, so taking the child out of the seat and holding them just because they start to cry is nothing short of counterproductive.

Instead, consider adjusting the temperature and humidity inside the car or playing your child's favorite music to create a comfortable atmosphere and relaxing mood Γ

Try to take breaks during long drives for a change of pace!

Please remain patient while your child becomes used to the car seat.
